BOXES TO TROOPS -- The Livermore Veterans Foundation's "Christmas-in-a-Box" has sent out 76 very large boxes to units stationed in Afghanistan and Iraq.

In conjunction with Groth Brothers Chevrolet, Carl's Jr., UNCLE Credit Union, the Josefa Higuera Livermore Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution, Country Charm and the Cedar Grove Community Church, more than 800 soldiers will receive Christmas packages. Each adopted unit will also receive a package to share with all their soldiers including items such as 2foot tall plastic Christmas trees with battery operated lights, extra batteries, fake snow and aerosol cans of "Christmas tree fragrance" to make the time away from home a little less lonely.

Since the adoption in 2003 of a single company from the 101st Airborne Division, the program has grown into the adoption of an entire battalion from the 101st - the 2nd Battalion of the 502 Regiment. Organizations around the Tri-Valley such as the Livermore Veterans Foundation, Operation: S.A.M, Pleasanton Military Families, Blue Star Moms and a host of individuals make the difference in the lives of our servicemen and women overseas.

This is just one example of an ongoing process of support for our troops in Iraq and Afghanistan and other points around the globe. You'll be making that soldier, sailor, airman or Marine's life just a bit easier.
